## Level 2: "God is With Us!

## Focus: God sends His Son to Earth to Save Us

The whole earth prepares for the birth of Christ as we recognize the different calls or signs heard in the church hymns. We greet the child Jesus who is "God with Us" but raised as a child in a human family with his mother Mary, and Joseph. Jesus' parents bring Him to the Temple. Simeon and Anna recognize Him as the one who comes to save us.

- **Relate** personal experiences with promises, both kept and broken.
- Listen for and identify the gospel reading of the Sunday before the Nativity as the genealogy (family tree) of Jesus Christ.

<ul> <li>Using the verses of Christmas Eve, explain what the different parts of God's creation offered Christ at His birth.</li> <li>Understand the role of the angels at the Nativity</li> <li>Recite their greeting: "Glory to God in the highest!"</li> <li>Sing the troparion of the Nativity.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Give reasons why you think it was important for Jesus to come to us as a real person.</li> <li>Sing the refrain: "for God is with us!" as the verses are chanted on the eve of the Feast of the Nativity</li> <li>Tell the story of Jesus' being brought to the Temple as a little child.</li> <li>Sing the prayer of St. Simeon.</li> </ul>
